(DP):

- There is an ambitious agenda for the next Planning/Zoning Board Meeting.

Mike Lane (ML) Update:

-Offered 12/23/2022 flooding photos via e-mail (attached to Minutes).

Input for KEC Mtg. 1/23/23

Horseshoe Crab Signage - Keyport Harbor Commission (KHC) is actively surveying all the waterfront signage and preparing a signage plan, KEC needs to coordinate with KHC.

Port 149 Bulkhead not presently built to permitted specs with: 1.) splash pad and ground at elevation top of bulkhead, 2.) ~5 feet of vinyl sheeting patched on top of old steel sheeting, and 3.) old piles still in last ~50 feet.

FP Bulkhead – Est of \$2M for new bulkhead at 1/17/22 KBC meeting not in alignment with CME \$ 4M to raise parking lot and Am Legion Drive by Post Office.

BPM Boat Fire - Missing required stand-pipe for fire protection on expanded pier. Fire hydrant on site is not operational.

Aeromarine Regular Water and Soil Testing - Is this sampling in the test wells on the site and have the reports been provided to KEC? The Baykeeper has received permission to install water quality monitoring equipment on KYC underwater site.

Kean U survey – When the Princeton U graduate student team measured transects along the waterfront, they were accompanied by Bob Burlew and/or me. Before any private property was accessed the owner was briefed and access approval obtained. At the start of the project a scope-of-work (SOW) was generated and students were briefed in a classroom session on Borough and FEMA waterfront models (beaches vs bulkheads). Need a SOW from Kean U team.

Keyport Towers and Marina - Updated plans given to Council Redev. Committee with one less story and some minor front façade changes. Notice for environmental study and remediation activities was posted, 8/3/22. **Suggest that KEC chair request all the LSRP reports generated by this investigation.** Having these reports for Aeromarine has been very beneficial for the Borough.

Browns Point Marina Notice for new CAFRA application issued 8/3/22 covering office and maintenance building, boat rack expansions, fueling tanks, and additional fueling docks. Plans show fuel tanks unanchored and on ground in SFHA. There should be a full copy of the application in the KEC mail slot in Borough Hall. **Any action to pick up documents?**

Mystic at Keyport/Deputy Ventures – Application for a new CAFRA permit noticed 8/28/22. Homes on piles with breakaway walls, etc. that need to be certified by a qualified architect. Requirement that deeds advise buyers of flood risk and are approved by KUPB attorney, not evident in the project file.

Mariner's Village, Browns Point Marina Contamination - Roger Miller's 2/4/22 status report identifies dirt pile at end of Washington St as 'historic fill' to be used on the apartment lot by EOY 2022. KEC letter regarding contaminated fill at the north end of Washington Street is still not addressed. Fences required to keep humans out of contaminated areas are still not documented.

KUPB Hearings

25 E Front – During the 11/2022 KUPB meeting, the KUPB approved a 5-story mixed-use structure with a 16 parking space deficiency for 50 apartment units and a sidewalk level commercial area.

Nuisance Flooding

Division and East Front Basin Flooding – The Beach Park 30-inch Outfall Pipe problem with the significantly restricted outfall pipe capacity due to the duckbill on the end of the pipe remains. Without a pump to push/force the water through the duckbill flooding continues. A fix was not a 2022 budget item.

East Third St Flooding – Drainage-ditch/floodway along Henry Hudson Trail (HHT) between Atlantic and Manchester flows to the pipe under the HHT just east of Manchester Street. This 20-inch pipe dumps water into the street below the HHT flooding homes on E Third and E Fifth Streets. Hudson Pointe is now approved to discharge their stormwater into the pit abutting this pipe under the HHT, which will further intensify the flooding issue on E Fifth and E Third. This stormwater should flow down the HHT drainage-ditch past Fulton to Chingarora Creek. County and Borough officials have still taken no action to clear the HHT drainage-ditch between Manchester and Fulton Streets.

Harbor Pollution and Erosion Clogging Waterways

Aeromarine Landfill – No update on efforts to end the pollution of Keyport Harbor due to toxins leaking from the landfill site at Aeromarine. Council review of Aeromarine lawsuit was a closed session item at the 7/19/22 KBC meeting. No update on efforts to eliminate the continuing erosion that is silting in the adjacent bay and creek. It is also exposing landfill trash.

Approved Projects

333 First Street – Walnut St side of site flooded by 12/23/22 high tide

Raritan Bay/Cove – Retaining wall installed parallel to creek will not serve as a bulkhead due to its height above the creek. Construction of the new buildings is progressing slowly.

31 West Front St – Condition of approval was delineation of flood zone boundaries (VE, LIMWA, and AE) in this SFHA. Need a report from a certified Flood Plain Manager. CAFRA permit and Floodplain Development Permit are required. Tenants were told in January 2023 that they had 30 days to vacate their businesses and apartments.

317 Beers Street – No update regarding continuing wetland infringement in violation of 8/25/2005 NJDEP FILL Permit. No enforcement action by the Borough.

New Business:

(KD):

- Will coordinate with KEC members to order quantity/types of trees/shrubs for planting at Cedar Street Park dune in late March/early April.

(MT):

- We should post signage educating all about the new trees/bushes as to what they are and how they help the environment.

(MP):

- Believes that we need to order a minimum quantity of trees/bushes. Provided an updated order form attached at end of Minutes.

(KD):

- The seedling giveaway does attract residents.

(MP):

- Monmouth County has assisted in giving away trees in the past.

(MP):

- The problem with planting on the Henry Hudson Trail is that they mow along the sides of the trail.

(MP):

- Perhaps the KEC can give away trees on Arbor Day (Friday, April 28, 2023)?

(MT):

- Perhaps we can combine the Spring Planting with a Tree Giveaway?

(KD):

- No decision on the tree giveaway just yet.

(MP):

- Monmouth County has assisted in giving away trees in the past.
- Steve Gallo has contacted the Forest Service one time.
- There are no indigenous bushes or trees that lantern flies do not like.
- It is more efficient to catch lantern flies when they are nymphs.

(MT):

- Chemical sprays that harm lantern flies also hurt other insects.

(KD):

- We should not plant trees that attract the lantern flies.

(ML):

- Believes the KEC should agree on a Top Ten List of KEC Initiatives.

Association of New Jersey Environmental Commissions

(ANJEC) Subscription Renewal Request:

(KD):

- Requested that the KEC renew its annual subscription to ANJEC for \$450.
- **JS** motioned to approve spending \$450 to subscribe to ANJEC for one (1) year; **MP** 2nd; No comments/edits/revisions; Unanimously Approved.

Recycled Evergreen Program:

(KD):

- KEC will weave whatever evergreen trees are present together above the Cedar Street Park Dune low-lying area on Saturday, February 11th, 2023, at 9:30am (rain Date Sunday, Feb. 12th, at 9:30am). Wear appropriate clothing. The KEC will also take care of the pile of beer cans present at the Aeromarine Site previously identified in an e-mail (Attached to Minutes).

(KD):

- Still no news on the Broad Street Crosswalk Painting.

(MP):

- Reiterated that the intersection of Broad Street and First Street is dangerous, as indicated by the loss of at least three (3) street light poles due to accidents.

(MP):

- There is a Clean Ocean Action Beach Clean-Up on Saturday, April 1st, 2023.

Attached are photos of flooded streets and properties in Keyport taken during a full moon high-tide in the morning around 7:00 AM on 12/23/22. These streets and sites are in the Borough Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHA).

Below is a picture of flooding on West Front Street. The tidal level exceeded the elevation of the new Port 149 bulkhead and the section of West Front Street between Beers Street and the Keyport Fishery. This water also flooded the abutting Apollo site.



As shown below, these floodwaters then extended into the approved site for 9 single-family homes at 44 Beers Street, the Deputy Ventures project. Future homeowners at this site would have experienced flooded garages and been unable to use their cars during this event. Beers Street flooding extended as far south as the driveway entrance to the Oyster Point senior building, as shown below.



Below is a photo of flooding on Walnut Street adjacent to the new condo units at 333 First Street. Again, some future Keyport residents would experience garage flooding and not be comfortable exiting the complex in their car. The creek overflow flooded the approach to the new bridge and the intersection of First and Second Streets.



Flooding of streets and property occurs when the elevation of the surface of the bay water exceeds the road and ground elevation of sites in a SFHA. The depth of flooding is the difference between the surface water elevation and the ground and road elevation. Once the developer constructs homes on the SFHA site the elevation of the road and the home site are fixed. However, bay water surface levels are not fixed. Sea-Level-Rise (SLR) projections have been delineated in the NJ State 2014 Hazard Mitigation Plan to increase by more than 1 foot through 2050. This SLR will result in more frequent flooding and greater flooding depths, increasing the impact of this nuisance flooding. Presently the 12/23/22 level of tidal flooding occurs a couple of times a year. With Sea-Level-Rise, in the future this level of tidal flooding will occur every couple of months, a real flooding nuisance for these future Keyport homeowners settling in a SFHA.

The 2013 Flood Damage Prevention Ordinance (FDPO) #5-13 was in place when the KUPB approved the 44 Beers Street and 333 First Street projects in SFHAs. The stated purpose of this 2013 FDPO is to: a.) ensure that potential buyers are notified that the property is in a SFHA, and b.) ensure that those who occupy a SFHA are responsible for their actions. The 6/21/22 FDPO Section 801.2 requires that the new property Deeds for these SFHA sites delineate that: a.) the enclosure is likely to be inundated by floodwaters, and b.) the depth of flooding the site would experience with a Local Design Flood Elevation (BFE +3).

For these Keyport residents to comprehend the potential impact of this nuisance flooding on their quality of life, the purchasers of these homes in the SFHA need to review material from the Community Resilience team's research on flood risk, summarized in the attached Tutorial on Flood Risk. In alignment with the stated purpose/objective of the FDPO, a buyer signed confirmation of their receipt of this Tutorial should be filed with the Floodplain Administrator prior to receiving a CO for their unit in a SFHA.

This assumption of responsibility for developing the Keyport marsh areas with inadequate fill/elevation needs stay with the present and future owners of these SFHA sites and not be a future bill paid by the upland Keyport residents.
