Minutes of a Regular Meeting of the Mayor and Council, held on the above date in the Council Chambers, Municipal Complex, 70 W. Front Street, Keyport, N.J. pursuant to the Annual Notice on file with the Borough Clerk, forwarded to the Asbury Park Press, Courier, Independent, the Newark Star Ledger and Two River Times and posted on the Bulletin Boards in accordance with the Open Public Meetings Act, P.L. 1975, Ch. 231.

Council President June Atkins called the meeting to order at 7:04 P.M. and read the Sunshine Law Notice.

ROLL CALL

On Roll Call the following were present: Councilmembers Wedick, Doyle, Atkins, Hyer. Absent: Councilmen Bergen, Stalter. Others present were Mr. Kain, Borough Attorney.

Council went into closed session at 7:04 P.M. and this meeting was reconvened at 8:04 P.M.

Mayor Merla (arrived at 7:12 P.M.) called the meeting to order at 8:04 P.M. and read the Sunshine Law Notice.

ROLL CALL

On Roll Call the following were present: Councilmembers Wedick, Doyle, Atkins, Stalter (arrived at 7:10 P.M.), Hyer. Absent: Councilman Bergen. Others present: Mr. Kain, Borough Attorney and Mr. Freda, Borough Engineer.

Councilman Hyer led the Pledge of Allegiance/Moment of Silence.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

Councilman Wedick; Police: Mr. Wedick reported there is a PBA meeting scheduled for February 19, 2004.

Councilman Stalter; Fire: Mr. Stalter reported the new Fire truck will be delivered on Thursday; Fire Patrol will be starting an explorer group ages 15-18 years, which will meet on the third Wednesday of the month; Mr. Stalter will be attending the Board of Chiefs meeting next week.

Councilman Hyer; Public Works/Recycling/Property Maintenance: Mr. Hyer reported on the following items: Christmas Tree will be picked up; there was a water main break; Public Works is salting and sanding; there was a sump pump problem which required supplies and man hours; water meters are being read

and readings checked for high readings; a small dump truck will arrive in the Borough this week; The Borough Engineer attended the Harbor Commission Meeting; Mr. Carton, Atlantic Street and Hwy 36, had a concern which was responded to, he sent a letter regarding questions. (Mayor Merla thanked the Public Works for snow removal.)

Councilwoman Atkins; Health/Recreation/Parks: Mrs. Atkins reported on the following: She attended the First Aid meeting and stated they asked for consideration at budget time; she attended the Recreation meeting and received a list of concert dates, and reported a new director was hired; she attended the Board of Health meeting but there was no quorum; she attended the Redevelopment meeting; she attended the Drug Alliance meeting (three people showed up for meeting) and reported an assessment is needed and due to county. Kathy Shaw entered the KBA in a Tourism Awards Marketing Contest.

Councilman Bergen; Finance: Absent.

Councilman Doyle; Building & Grounds/Library: Mr. Doyle reported on our move to the new Municipal Complex over the weekend and that there were some glitches.

Administrator Poling: Mrs. Poling reported on our move to the New Municipal Complex and advised on status.

Engineer Freda: Mr. Freda reported 1) Atlantic Street design is ready and that the gas company will need an extension of time. (Mayor Merla asked if the gas line is over the sewer and he has a contact name; 2) Department of Public Works is progressing on schedule and that he is meeting with his people and George Sappah; 3) a Bulkhead meeting scheduled with Mr. Garafalo and he is getting feedback from the Borough Planner.

Attorney Kain: Mr. Kain reported 1) Magic Touch Oral Arguments were scheduled for January 9, 2005 and it went well re land owner and that Judge O'Hagan reserved his decision; 2) Therese Street Project will be awarded tonight (base bid only); and 3) a Redevelopment meeting was held Thursday night which showed courtesy, consideration and respect.

Mayor Merla: Mayor Merla apologized for being late stating he brought the meeting had been cancelled and reported on the following: He spoke with the (Redevelopment) Planner, they will modify the plan and maps, and will adopt same at the next meeting - and asked if the site of Beers Street and West Front Street should be added to the scope? If added Kara Homes can go before the Planning Board, if not, it falls within the map area and they would make an informal presentation before the Planning Board. The Planner on Planning Board also gave his recommendation. The Aeromarine is too big not to include. Pilings are needed. (Mr. Kain advised that there will be an amendment to delete the homes by the Aeromarine.) Three task forces need to be created as follows: 1) Business; 2) Residential; 3) Ad Hoc and a list of names is being prepared. Thursday night's meeting was well run. There was a 1984 article and now, twenty years later, redevelopment. Former Mayor Bergen was quoted regarding redevelopment. The Army Corp of Engineers need to dredge the harbor and the boat ramp, and the Conover property needs to be condemned. He and Councilwoman Atkins discussed the Kelly Bills, Keyport Legion Apartments: he asked Wes Kain to contact

the manager. They are asking for the garbage \$2,350.00 to be deducted in lieu of taxes (is a percentage). Last month there were two police car accidents. There is a company that sells new police cars for \$1.00 for sponsorship on police cars using commercial advertisements. Advertisers are checked. Last Friday night was a meeting of the Bayshore Conference of Mayors, of which Mayor Merla is the Chairman, which Lt. Mitchell attended. The Task Force has had no raise in many years plus there is a \$2,500.00 fee from each town. The Task Force is successful due to the towns not the county. Ferry Service: the Borough has been approached by a company which has been in business for 70 years, that is interested in a recreational lease - they do not need a pier, they will put a barge in and front end load and are looking for a diversion. Circle Line own all the boats and will have a new boat which costs \$7,000,000.00. This will be discussed at the Harbor Commission Meeting. Mr. Kain spoke with the owner and with Green Acres and they would consider diversion along the bulkhead. The Borough would have to file for a diversion and hold public meetings. The 30 X 80 barge would be enclosed in a vinyl canopy. Mr. Wedick asked about dredging. Mayor Merla said none would be required and stated the Army Corp of Engineers are to set a date to come out. This will be listed on the February 3, 2004 Agenda. Building Department December revenues have never been this high in 18 years - \$22,000.00. The new Borough Hall Grand Opening is set for April, inviting dignitaries.

PUBLIC COMMENT PORTION

The Meeting was opened to the public at 8:47 P.M. for comments or questions.

Robert Zwingraf, Cedar Street, asked about Benjamin Terry Bulkhead meeting. (Contractor was also at the meeting.) Mr. Hyer said they discussed repairs and stated the Engineer is to make a recommendation. Mr. Freda stated it is an emergency situation and they are evaluating the data. It has been fenced off for now and is being monitored. No sheathing is included, only filling and grading off is being done and he recommended that stone and dirt be used. Mr. Freda stated the initial work will cost \$30,000.00 for remedial measures. It was recommended that the previous resolution be amended. George Sappah is to inspect the site. Mr. Zwingraf asked if Public Works can do the job? Mr. Freda replied, yes, but it takes away from their regular work. Mayor Merla commented it is dangerous job for Public Works. Mr. Zwingraf, asked where the cars will park for the ferry? Mayor Merla stated we need 150 spots. Mr. Zwingraf asked if they would be parked at the Bulkhead? Mayor Merla said the older sewer treatment plant could be used for a new three tier parking garage (no higher than West Front Street) that would hold 250 cars. Mr. Freda stated 80 spaces, plus 40 cars parking garage. Mayor Merla said if parking lot is used as a parking lot we have identified 39 spots. Green Acres said up to 150 spaces. Parking is an issue. George Walling, Second Street, asked about the property on Beers Street - Apollo Equipment still there. (Memo to be sent to Anthony Vecchio and Robert Burlew to remove. Mr. Walling advised there has been a gold chair on West Front Street since last Wednesday. He advised that the house on Osborn Street that had a fire in August 2003, the doors are open. (Mr. Hyer spoke with William Cerase). He asked about the use of St. Joseph's for people waiting on Maple Place for work. Chief Gajewski advised if there are over 30 officers on the Task Force Keyport has to send an officer every third year. American Legion Drive/Bulkhead, Mr. Freda said they would start in September/October and it will take 4-6 months just for the bulkhead. The lighting and promenade will take additional time. George Walling stated he and Kevin Graham were on the Municipal Complex committee and attended meetings on Borough Hall. He wants to commend everyone involved for a good job. Mrs. Atkins stated they looked at other buildings and it took time.

The Public Comment portion of the meeting was closed at 9:09 P.M.

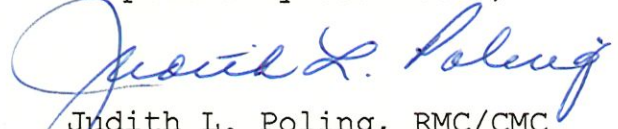

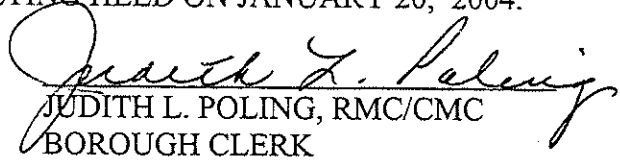

3. A certificate of availability of funds is annexed hereto.

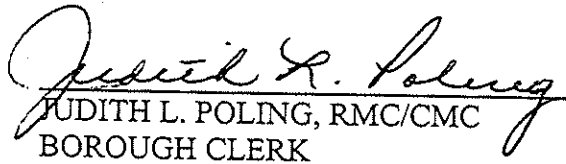

Re: Keyport Radio System Repair
Keyport Water Tower

Gentlemen:

On the evening of January 10th, we lost radio communication between the Keyport tank and our SCADA system, which is located at our main office. At the present time, this system is still inoperable. On January 11th, Allied Control Services investigated the problem at the Keyport tank and found that both the radio transceiver and the antenna cable need to be replaced. Allied Control has forwarded to us an estimate for this repair for \$3,885. A copy of their estimate is enclosed. Without the function of this equipment, Shorelands has no way to determine the elevation of the water in the tank. At the present time, we are in communication with your personnel who are supplying us with the necessary tank levels. If this line of communication should break down, it could result in overfilling the tank, not having an adequate supply of water in tank, or over-pressurizing Keyport's water system. It is imperative that these repairs are done as soon as possible.

Shorelands needs the authorization from Keyport to proceed with this work since all of the equipment belongs to the Borough and it is the Borough's responsibility to maintain this equipment.
